SENIOR FARMERS' MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM

Veggie Vouchers

Each year STEP office of Aging administers the Seniors Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP), designed to provide low-income seniors with access to locally grown fruits, vegetables, honey, and herbs by providing \$24 in veggie vouchers to eligible seniors. This year drive thru distribution was offered at many of STEP's Centers for Healthy Aging throughout Clinton and Lycoming counties. The event was hugely popular, and Office of Aging staff were able to distribute all 2,500 Veggie Vouchers.

JUNETEENTH 2022

Living Free + Healthy

Williamsport's second annual Juneteenth celebration was held in Brandon Park on Saturday, June 18. The event hosted by the Lycoming Tri-County NAACP in partnership with STEP, Inc., Community Zone, Penn Future, Williamsport YWCA, UPMC, and Lycoming County United Way welcomed people from all walks of life to celebrate and recognize Black culture, struggle, and triumph. The day was full of unifying activities that began as a Freedom Walk from Freedom Road Cemetery and ended at Brandon Park, where local businesses and social organizations lined the area around the bandshell.

Juneteenth commemorates the end of slavery and is a day of joy, celebration, and a recommitment to the values of freedom and building a good community for all. This year's theme, Juneteenth – Living Free & Healthy, focused on the importance and interconnection of all aspects of health: mental, physical, and financial.

> During the celebration, many acts shared the stage, including an interactive fitness class/demo led by Nisan Trotter of Trot Fitness in Lewisburg, a Pan-African dance and drumming performance by Umoja, a group of current and former Lycoming College students, plus other spoken word and musical performers. Line dancing, a facilitated drum circle, and quided meditation were also offered.





STEP provided many of the promotional materials for this year's event including the Juneteenth 2022 Living Free & Healthy logo, t-shirts, and bookmarks. STEP's Social Justice Task Force provided and distributed this year's Juneteenth t-shirts, the first in a series set to continue each year in commemoration of the event! The Social Justice Task Force is made up of STEP staff from various departments, many of whom were in attendance with information to share with the community, including: Early Learning Resource Center Region 7, STEP Head Start, and STEP AmeriCorps.









AmeriCorps is a national service program that provides thousands of Americans of all ages and backgrounds with education awards in exchange for a year or two of community service. The STEP AmeriCorps program partners with numerous nonprofit organizations and schools in Clinton, Lycoming, and Tioga counties to provide service opportunities to meet the region's community needs.

In July, STEP AmeriCorps members gathered at the West End Christian Community Center in Newberry to complete their final group project of the 2021-2022 service year: priming and painting the building's handicap accessible ramp!

To celebrate the service year ending in August, STEP AmeriCorps welcomed current members and alumni aboard the Hiawatha Riverboat where this year's participants were recognized for their contributions and successful completion of the service term.

Medicare



Medicare Open Enrollment October 15 through December 7

Medicare open enrollment – also known as Medicare's annual election period – runs from October 15 through December 7 each year. (Although Medicare's open enrollment period ends on December 7 each year, extended enrollment opportunities are available to people in areas where FEMA declares an emergency or major disaster that hampers your ability to complete your enrollment during the normal window.)

During this annual window, Medicare plan enrollees can reevaluate their coverage – whether it's Original Medicare with supplemental drug coverage, or Medicare Advantage – and make changes or purchase new policies if they want to do so.
