 - Read a book at bedtime
- State the behavior that you want to see, not the one that you do not
 - Play games when at necessary appointment/errands to keep child calm and engaged

What is PBIS?



PBIS creates a more positive school experience.

Three “Bee” Rules:
Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Responsible

Teaches positive behavior at home, school and the community.

Children are recognized for positive behavior.

Why does PBIS work?

- Lets the child know that they are safe
- Awareness of child's needs and interests
- Connecting Home and School expectations
 - Involve families
 - Teach social skills
- Build strong relationships between Families and School Staff
 - Establish consistent routines
- Provide activities based on child's activity and skill level
 - Offers choices
- Model appropriate social skills and positive behavior



Why build social-emotional health?

- Help children express emotions in a healthy way
 - Teach emotional regulation, friendship and problem-solving skills
